Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Gabion Technologies BD Ltd. (the Company), which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 March, 2024, and the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view, of the financial position of the Company as at 31 March, 2024, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the period then ended in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (ISAs). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (IESBA Code) together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Bangladesh, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these ethical requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Emphasis of Matter

The company was unable to provide us with an updated Schedule X, which is required to be updated regularly as per the Companies Act, 1994. As a result, we were unable to confirm the shareholders' stake in the company.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with IFRSs, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.



Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with ISAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements

As part of an audit in accordance with ISAs, we exercise professional judgement and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud
 or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that
 is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material
 misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve
 collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures
 that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the
 effectiveness of the Company's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of management's use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial statements or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the Company' financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

1 Reporting entity

1.1 Legal status of the company

Gabion Technologies BD Ltd. is a private limited company duly incorporated in Bangladesh on 06 June 2021 having Registration No.C-171517/2021 under the Companies Act 1994.

1.2 Nature of business

To carry on the business of 1st Class Contractor, Crash Barrier steelwork, Geosynthetics solution, Geotextile Earthwall, Double Twisted Hexagonal Steel Wire, Stone, all kinds of sand, Reinforced Earth Walls, Concrete Pilling Block, Hollow block, all kind block.

2 Basis of preparation of financial statements

2.1 Basis of measurement

The Financial Statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, following the accrual accounting basis and the International Accounting Standards (IASs) and International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) as adopted in Bangladesh.

2.2 Components of financial statements

Our financial statements includes of the following components:

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2.4 Legal compliance

The financial statements have been prepared, and the information disclosures have been made per the requirements of the IFRSs, The Companies Act (#18), 1994, and other applicable laws and regulations. The Company is also comply with the following laws and regulations:

- a) The Income Tax Act, 2023
- b) Value Added Tax and Supplementary Duty Act, 2012
- c) Value Added Tax and Supplementary Duty Rules, 2016

2.5 Functional and presentation currency

These financial statements are presented in Bangladesh Taka (Taka/BDT), which is the company's functional currency. All financial information presented in Taka has been rounded to the nearest integer.

2.6 Use of judgments, estimates and assumptions

In preparing these financial statements, management has made judgment, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

2.7 Reporting period

The reporting period is from 01 April 2023 to 31 March 2024. These financial statements are prepared for the purpose of consolidation with the parent.

3.00 Significant accounting policies

Accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to periods presented in these financial statements.

Set out below is details of the significant accounting policies of the company.

3.1 Current versus non-current classification

The company presents assets and liabilities in statement of financial position based on current/non-current classification. An asset is current when it is:

- i) expected to be realized or intended to be sold or consumed in normal operating cycle;
- ii) held primarily for the purpose of trading;
- iii) expected to be realized within twelve months after the reporting period; or
- iv) cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least

All other assets are classified as non-current.

- A liability is current when it is:
- i) expected to be settled in normal operating cycle
- ii) held primarily for the purpose of trading
- iii) due to be settled within twelve months after the reporting period or
- iv) there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after

The company classifies all other liabilities as non-current.

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3.2 Financial assets (investments in share markets)

Initial recognition

Under IFRS 9, on initial recognition, a financial asset (Equity investment in shares) is measured at cost.

Subsequent measurement

Requirement of IFRS:

A financial asset is required to be measured subsequently at Fair Value through Other Comprehensive Income (FVTOCI); or Fair Value through Profit or Loss (FVTPL). The classification of financial assets under IFRS 9 is based on the business model in which a financial asset is managed and its contractual cash flow characteristics. According to the business model of the Company, the investments in shares are to be measured as FVTOCI. These equity investments designated as FVTOCI are measured subsequently at fair value. Income is recognized as income in profit or loss unless the income clearly represents a recovery of part of the cost of the investment. Other net gains and losses are recognized in OCI and are never reclassified to profit or loss.

3.3 Accruals and provisions

Accruals

Accruals are liabilities to pay for goods or services that have been received or supplied but have not been paid, invoiced or formally agreed with the supplier, including amounts due to employees. Accruals are reported as part of the payables.

Provisions

A provision is recognized in the statement of financial position when the company has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. Provision is ordinarily measured at the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the reporting date. Where the company expects some or all of a provision to be reimbursed, the reimbursement is recognized as a separate asset but only when the reimbursement is virtually certain. The expense relating to any provision is presented in the income statement net of any reimbursement. If the effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are discounted using a current pre-tax rate that reflects, where appropriate, the risks specific to the liability. Where discounting is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognized as a finance cost.

3.4 Dividend income from Investment

Dividend income is recognized when the Company's right to receive the payment is established.

3.5 Income Tax

Current tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the period, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous periods. The tax rates used for the reporting periods are 25% on business profit and 20% on dividend income.

3.6 Going concern

The company has adequate resources to continue its operation for the foreseeable future. For this reason the directors continue to adopt going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. The group will provide sufficient fund to meet the present requirements of its existing business, if and when required.

3.7 Event after reporting period

There are no events after reporting events during this year.
